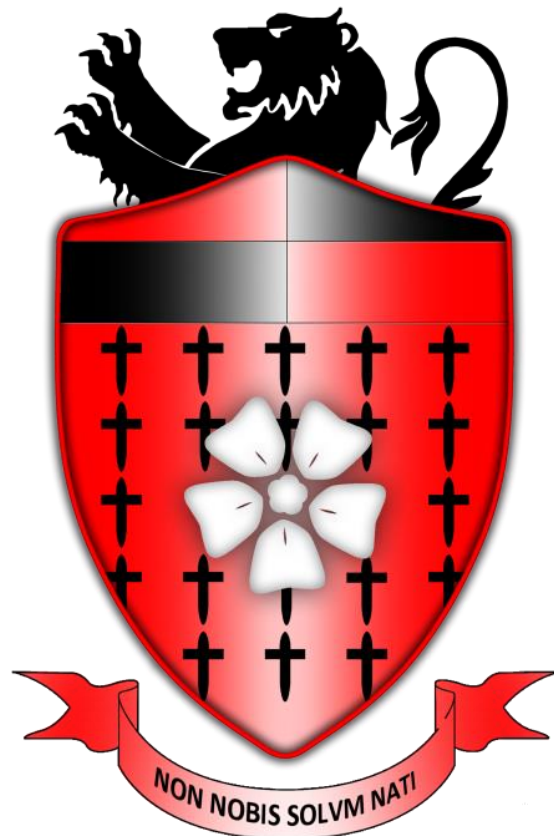

## PROVIDER ACCESS POLICY

### **Covid-19 Addendum – September 2021**

HSLC will endeavour to offer students the same opportunities and experiences relating to career and destinations learning where possible, for the academic year 2021/22. However, it may be possible that some of these activities will need to be revised in order to protect students, staff, visitors and our community.

Revised Arrangements may therefore include: Remote/online based activities (eg: as an alternative to visitors in school)

### **Introduction:**

This policy statement sets out the school's arrangements for managing the access of providers to students at the school for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the school's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

### **Student entitlement:**

All students in years 8-13 are entitled to:

- Find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeships opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point;
- Hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships – through options events, assemblies and group discussions and taster events;
- Understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.
